

Chicago, Oct. 27.—Eighty thousand employees of western railways are expected to demand a 20 per cent. increase in wages, following similar action taken by 1000 yardmen in the Chicago district last Saturday.

Chicago will be the centre of the fight, for this district has for years set the wage scale on the roads running west from a line drawn thru Duluth, Chicago, Cairo and New Orleans.
