STORY OF THE WRECK.

Told by Chairman Laird of the Examination Committee. J. C. Laird of 41 Melbourne-avenue, the chairman of the committee in charge of the excursion, was seen at his home Sunday.

Prize for the Firemen.

"As the ship settled down I watched what was taking place. The paddles were drenched and grimy, but not exactly a sea-faring man I cannot say that I had any doubt of their ability to steady the boat in her touching the bottom."

Panic Among Passengers.

"Down below, among the women, the word 'spread like wildfire.' Every one was talking of the wreck. The boat is wrecked, could be near, and we were to be taken care of on the verge of going."

Time and Compass Course.

"It must be stated that the Argyle was being run on a 'time and compass' course, instead of by land indicators. The words of the captain to Mr. Laird in some way the speed of the boat had been mistaken. The point where the boat went upon the rocks was some distance from Oshawa, and it is evident that this grave miscalculation was the cause of the disaster."
