The coroner was notified and decided that no inquest was necessary. King left here on Tuesday for Goderich and came back on Wednesday. On Thursday he went to Guelph and on returning in the evening went to Livingstone's electric light plant, where he stayed with Mr. John Nivins the engineer, till the lights were put out. They parted at the road, King stating that he was going home. Instead he evidently went to the cooper shop and took his life. No reason can be given for the deed.

He leaves a wife and two daughters
