

TELLS WASHINGTON HOUSE GREAT LAKES ROUTE BIG BENEFIT

Wisconsin Representative Scores Selfish New York View.

WASHINGTON, March 19.-Urging deep water route from the Great Lakes through the St. Lawrence River to the ocean, Representative Nelson, Republican, Wisconsin, told the House today that such a project would benefit fourteen states. He said it should be the "concern of the other 34 states to unite in promoting whatever measure will accomplish that end."

Better distribution of products of farms, factories and mine would result from completion of the project, he said, adding that opponents are chiefly New York interests which fear for the prestige of the country's principal port and foresee the abandonment of the "costly New York barge canal."

"The time has passed." he said. "when any one section of the United States should dictate our national and commercial policy. There must be balanced on one hand the country-wide benefit which will undoubtedly accrue from a cheap transportation from the Great Lakes to the sea, and on the other hand, the possible, though not probable loss to the country through a dimunition of the ports of the state and more particularly the port of New York."
