COULD AVOID ACCIDENTS.

Factory Inspectors Say There Are Too Many Fatalities.

The department of agriculture has issued an appendix to the annual report of the inspector of factories, dealing with accidents. The report says that records of accidents in European countries, as well as in Canada, show beyond reasonable doubt, that a great portion of accidents are avoidable.

There were 638 industrial accidents in Ontario reported to the inspectors in 1904, 633 in 1905, and 636 in 1906.

"While in no case criminal negligence was charged," the report says, "it is obvious that if manufacturers and workmen entered into the true spirit of protection, much of this slaughter could be avoided."

It is pointed out that in the Province of Quebec, the manufacturers have subscribed generously to a fund for the purchase of models of safety appliances that might be adopted as preventives against machinery. In Quebec the law requires the manufacturers to provide an emergency box or medicine chest, and in some cases manufacturers are so interested in this work as to employ medical men to visit their factories and instruct their employees as to methods to follow when using these auxiliary appliances in event of an accident.

CAN'T STOP INFLUX.

No Law Against Unemployed From U. S. Coming Here.

Referring to a despatch from Niagara Falls that large numbers of unemployed men from the United States were swarming over the border, it was stated at the parliament buildings yesterday that under the law nothing can be done to restrain the influx, as only the physically and mentally unfit can be prevented from entering Canada.

ADOPTS ONTARIO SYSTEM.

Nova Scotia Sends Engineer to Inspect Our Roads.

J. W. Mackenzie, assistant engineer of the public works department of Nova Scotia, has been in the province past few weeks investigating the system of road making at the last session of the Nova Scotia Legislature an act was passed altering the system of providing for the maintenance of provincial roads, by abolishing state labor and substituting therefore a system of taxation and government grants to the municipalities, as existing in Ontario. Mr. Mackenzie has visited the counties of Wentworth, Halton, York and Grey.

EIGHT HOUR DAY.

It is the Supreme Object to Be Obtained, Says Labor.

NORFOLK, Va., Nov. 22.—The American Federation of Labor to-day, declaring a universal eight-hour day, demanding a universal eight-hour day, and calling where the earnings are so meagre as to make it difficult to maintain a fair standard of living—called for campaign of education and organization among all affiliated organizations that will aid in bringing about the desired end.

LONDON TO GET EXPERTS TO CHECK REPORT OVER

Hon. Adam Beck Urges That It Be Done—Will Strengthen Support of Bylaw.

LONDON, Ont., Nov. 22.—Chairman Gillean and City Engineer Graydon will go to Toronto to confer with the electrical engineering firm of Smith, Kerry & Chase. The purpose is to have the experts of this firm check over the figures as submitted by the hydro-electric commission engineers for a distribution plant in this city.

This of course is contrary to the decision of the special committee of which Ald. Gillean is chairman, but the chairman states that he will pay the expense out of his own pocket, if necessary. This has, however, been obviated by the fact that Ald. Gerry, acting mayor, to-day empowered the chairman to go to Toronto.

Hon. Adam Beck, at a meeting of the committee urged rather strongly that the committee should take some such means of verifying the figures of the commission's engineers. "It will relieve us of responsibility to a certain extent," he said.

Subsequent to the meeting, when it had been decided that no verification was necessary, and that the estimate of the engineers would be received as submitted, Hon. Mr. Beck addressed the aldermen, stating that upon his own responsibility he would ensure the passing of the bylaw when it comes to the people if there is no avenue of question left open as might be the fact if independent engineers do not go over the figures.

The hydro-electric commission have received a request from the South-western Traction Co. that they furnish figures at which the company may have Niagara power for the operation of their cars. Hon. Adam Beck is endeavoring to arrange with the company whereby the Village of Port Stanley, also Lambton and Talbotville, as well as the farmers along the route will be able to secure power from the company.

TWO PROMOTIONS IN MILITIA DEPARTMENT

Major C. F. Winter and Major R. A. Helmer to Step Up Higher.

OTTAWA, Nov. 22.—(Special.)—Two promotions of Ottawa men in the militia departments, it is understood, will soon be made. Major C. F. Winter will become assistant to the deputy adjutant-general, Major Panet, and Major R. A. Helmer is to succeed Col. Cartwright as assistant adjutant-general for musketry.

Major Winter has a long record of active service, and is recognized as a practical military man, whose ideas carry weight. He is secretary of Gen. Lake, secretary of the Dominion Rifle League, and major of the Governor-General's Foot Guards. He served in the Egyptian expedition of 1882, taking part in the battle of Tel-el-Khuffi. He has a medal with clasp and a divisional bronze star for his services. He was severely wounded in the North-west rebellion at the action of Cut Knife Hill, and was in the South African war, taking part in several engagements. He served as assistant adjutant of the 2nd battalion of the Royal Canadian Regiment of Infantry, and a South African medal with three clasps.

TO REDUCE GRADES.

Improvement of 21 Miles of T. & N. O. Track Being Considered.

The Temiskaming and Northern Ontario Railway commission is considering a proposal to reduce the grades of the railway from 1-1/2 to 1-3/4 per cent. on a stretch of 21 miles north of North Bay. The reduction of grade will increase the mileage by seven miles, but it is said it will enable a locomotive to pull three times the number of cars. Estimates of the cost are being prepared.

RESISTED ARREST.

Mounted Policeman Shoots an Eccentric Farmer.

GRENFELL, Sask., Nov. 22.—R. Braithwaite, a farmer living a few miles south of here, was shot and seriously, if not fatally, wounded by a mounted policeman named Moses while resisting arrest yesterday.

Braithwaite is an eccentric who refuses to pay taxes, when compelled by legal process to do so, and has been shot at a bailiff who was attempting to serve a distress warrant. He was arrested for this offence, but let out on bail. Efforts have been made since to secure him for trial, but he has resisted successfully all attempts until today, when Moses, assisted by another mounted policeman from Regina, decided to take him at any cost. In the scuffle Braithwaite was seriously wounded and is now under a surgeon's care at Weyburn. He has a brother in Vancouver.

10,000 ITALIANS CAME TO CANADA IN 1906

ROME, Nov. 22.—(C.A.P.)—10,752 Italians emigrated to Canada in 1906, and 10,399 Austro-Hungarians in 1905, the latest return available.

Navigation Co's Trunk.

MONTREAL, Nov. 22.—The Canadian St. Lawrence Navigation Company has gone into liquidation on the demand of the directors. Anselma Labrecque, Mishaps and the difficulty of securing additional capital to carry on the business are ascribed as the cause.
