to confront them. But considerable bodies of German troops have been despatched to Turkey and are posted at strategic points.

The chief incident in this second battle of Verdun yesterday was the delivery of a series of violent offensive attacks by the Germans against a small sector of the front line between the Hindenburg Wood and the Thiessmont Wood, north of Verdun and east of the Meuse.

In Italy and the Tyrol the chief fighting was in the Lagarino Valley and at Pasubio. There fierce and heavy attacks were launched against Col di Buolo last night and early this morning, and they were repulsed.

The Russians announce that their troops operating in the region of Kermanshah and Kasr-i-Shirin have effected a junction with the British forces on the Tigris River below Kut-el-Amara.

On the Tigris River below Kut-el-Amara the readjustment of the Turkish line has resulted in the gaining of a point of vantage by British artillery on the right bank of the river.

The Turks claim that they have compelled Russian forces from Persia to cease their advance on Shakin in the vicinity of the Mesopotamian frontier.

On the Turko-Egyptian frontier the Royal Flying Corps, which has been constantly harassing the enemy since the air attack on Port Said, did a good piece of work at Rodhaleim by smashing the water tanks and at El-Hamma seriously damaging buildings and a plant.

BORDEN IS THREATENED WITH QUEBEC'S WRATH

Premier's Stand on Bilingual Question Makes Him a Target.

OTTAWA, May 25.—As an aftermath of the discussion in parliament on the question of bilingual schools, a number of anonymous letters are being received by the premier. They are threatening in their tone, and some of them assert that if some action is not taken, even before the privy council, the issue of the Conservative party must accept the political consequences. The Quebec election is cited as an evidence of what may be expected.

According to the latest advice the case will be argued in London in July, but being wholly provincial in its scope, the Dominion will not be represented.

FELL TO DEATH Halifax Man and Wife Plunged Over Cliff.

HALIFAX, N.S., May 25.—Early this morning the bodies of Matthew Lownds, 50, and his wife, Halifax, were found pinned beneath an overturned carriage in the outskirts of the city. CAPT. SNEATH IN BOULOGNE HOSPITAL. Special to The Toronto World.

WOODSTOCK, May 25.—Word has been received by his parents here that Capt. D'Arcy Sneath is in hospital in Boulogne, suffering from shell shock. Capt. Sneath was one of the first to go to the front with the 5th Mounted Rifles as a lieutenant, and for his gallant conduct in the field he was promoted to a captaincy. Three times during March and April of this year he has received honorable mention in the reports of the official eye-witnesses. On one occasion he conducted a reconnaissance party close to the enemy lines and secured valuable information and drawings of German barb wire entanglements.

FOUR BURNED TO DEATH. FORT WILLIAM, Ont., May 25.—Four lives were lost in a fire early today which destroyed the home of Joseph Charley, aged 6, and Agnes Charley, aged 5, and their two children, aged 13 and 15. The youngest child, a boy of three, was badly burned. It is thought the fire started from an overheated stove.

ABLE TO APPEAR IN COURT. BERLIN, Ont., May 25.—P. C. James Blovinas has so far recovered. His physician has given his consent for the officer to attend court Friday, when he will appear against Pte. Joseph Meisinger, who is charged with aggravated assault. On April 25 last the officer, who was serving a subpoena on the soldier, was struck heavily twice and then the soldier has been in the county jail and the officer under the doctor's care.
