TIPPLE WAS WILD LEAF NOSED OUT

Grays Overcame Early Lead
—Warhop Failed This Time
—See-Saw Affair

Providence, R.I., June 21.—The Grays made it an even split on the four games thus far played off here, taking the measure of the Leafs this afternoon by a 7-6 score. The contest was by far the best yet played here by the two teams, and was anybody's game until the last man was out. The Leafs seemed and alternated in the lead; the score was tied two or three times during the advantage shifting from side to side.

The Grays presented a shifted line-up because of the illness of Cooney, who was the victim of a drugist's mistake in giving him a powerful acid instead of boric acid for an eye wash. Cooney had a narrow escape from losing his eyesight, but may be back in the game in a week. Van Gress pitched the entire game for the Grays, and was in splendid form, striking out eight of the Leafs, and with fast fielding, would have held his opponents to half the runs scored.

Errors of omission cropped out a half-dozen times, and the locals did everything in their power to give the game to the visitors, but just as the Leafs were apparently set for an avalanche of Toronto runs, somebody pulled a phenomenal stunt and the situation was saved.
