This establishment is a credit to the Merchants of Halifax, and those, under whose more immediate hands it is conducted, and may be ranked with any in the Colonies, as to the variety of information to be derived from the number and variety of English, Scotch, Irish, American and Colonial Papers, Lloyd's Lists, Army and Navy Lists, Reviews and Magazines, that are to be found on the tables. Arrivals and departures of all descriptions of vessels are carefully kept account of, and lists containing the names of vessels, loading, where bound, Agent, wharf, and date of sailing;---the names of those vessels to sail in the course of the day are also exhibited every morning. There are upwards of 250 Subscribers, who pay twenty five shillings annually. Strangers visiting the Town, Officers of the Army and Navy, and Captains of Merchantmen, are introduced to the rooms by the Subscribers, and entered into the visitors' book.

The Rooms are in the Exchange, and open every day from 6 o'clock, A. M. to 10 o'clock, P. M. excepting on Sunday during the hours of Divine Service.

Hours of attendance for issuing and receiving Books, from 12 to 3 o'clock, every day in the year, (Sundays and holidays excepted.) The Library Rooms are kept in the premises, adjoining the Office of the Attorney General, in Hollis Street. The number of Shareholders are one hundred and twenty; the original value of the shares was £5, and have since sold for £16. The affairs of this institution have been increasing in prosperity for two or three years back. At the annual inspection of books in July last, there were reported, in the Library, in good order, 2725 volumes; two thirds of which consist of quarto and octavo size, lettered and full bound in calf. The Quarterly Reviews, and Monthly Magazines, are also imported, and after the allotted time for issuing in numbers, are bound in volumes.---Subscribers are admitted to the Library, at the rate of forty shillings annually, or twelve shillings and six pence quarterly, payable in advance, and allowed a full set of Novels, or Works of that description at one time. Strangers visiting Halifax, are introduced to read during the hours the rooms are open.
