

Extract of letter from C. McCall Esq<sup>r</sup>  
Inspector of Indian Affairs, Winnipeg,  
Manitoba. dated August 6<sup>th</sup> 1879.

Sir,

With regard to the complaint of James Cook, Councillor of the Pas Indians that ~~they~~ did not receive their fair allowance of cattle and Agricultural implements, I beg to report, that there is no doubt, but what this is true, for Agents have been charged so frequently in Treaty No. 5, and hence no reliable requisitions have been received in this office for the ~~the~~ guidance of the Acting Superintendent to know what to send them, but now information of a definite character has been received that all the Bands of Treaty No. 5, who have not already received their stipulated number of Cattle who are prepared to receive them, and I would recommend that arrangements should be made at once to ship their Cattle to them this Summer, as it is impossible to do so in Winter. All the Agricultural implements and Seed Potatoes and garden seeds requisitioned for this year have
