### THE LATE JOHN CUDAHY.

John Cudahy, Chicago Board of Trade operator, banker and pioneer packer, who died at his home in Chicago last week, had never completely recovered from an operation for appendicitis which he underwent four years ago.

He sought to renew his health in California several months ago and since had been in the care of physicians. He is survived by his wife, two daughters and two sons.

No other men bore a higher reputation on the Chicago Board of Trade or in commercial circles there than John Cudahy. He was born in Ireland on Nov. 4, 1844, and in 1869 moved with

his family to Milwaukee. There he was educated and as a boy entered the packing industry, being employed in turn by Edward Roddis, Layton & Co., and John Plankinton, large packing house firms. He was the first appointed general provision inspector for the Board of Trade of Milwaukee.

He became a partner of Chapin & Co. in Chicago, in 1875, the firm becoming Chapin & Cudahy in 1877 and later the Cudahy Packing Company. As a speculator he had hardly an equal. He controlled with his brother the largest packing house in Milwaukee, and the principal packing houses in Louisville, the Stock Yards Company there, and a large plant at Nashville.

Sleashing Arrangement on Non-  
Enlistment by Justice  
Riddell

ADDRESS IN TORONTO

Mr. Justice Riddell Speaks at Veterinary College Commencement—  
Speaker Disgusted by Crowds  
of Young Men at Hockey Games

(Toronto Star)

A stirring and powerful address, the dominant note a call to arms, was delivered at the commencement of the Ontario Veterinary College by Hon. Mr. Justice W. R. Riddell, of the supreme court, commencing with a review of the great advances made in veterinary surgery during the last few years, the speaker urged upon his hearers their duty as leaders of men. "If the educated do not assume that position, others much less qualified will. I am sick and tired of the talk, largely cant, heard too often in educated circles of the 'party politicians,' the 'war politicians,' the 'boss,' and the like. If those who should lead abdicate their rights, let them hide their heads and not whine if those whom they consider their inferiors come to the front."

The speaker dwelt upon municipal politics, declaring that "Some one must do this work; if you think you can no better say so, state your reasons and try your hand. There is no disgrace in being a municipal politician, but the reverse, unless you are a municipal politician with no vision above the petty advantage to be gained by yourself or a clique or a party by your being a politician."

Plain Lying Plus Silly Sophistry.

"But there is now a more pressing duty than in times of peace," said Mr. Riddell, amid the applause of the audience at Convocation hall, "a duty differing in kind as well as degree. We are now in the midst of the birthright of all English-speaking people." Mr. Justice Riddell compared this right with the Prussian ideal, which he said made Germany dangerous today. He compared the divine right to rule as claimed by the Kaiser with the right of parliament to take or give power representing the people. If the Prussians were content to apply their principles to their own land we would have no complaint. Summed up, the Prussian ideal was that each man should have the power, and they should keep who can."

"This is a war of aggression, a war of conquest, conceived in greed and brought forth in the hands of men, and a brutal invasion of a peaceful and neutral country." The speaker charged that the Canadian boys are in the front line of the war, where the greatest drama of all time is being played, and we hope and pray that they will come back with the best results and can also speak of them in terms of greatest praise.

The Housing Problem.  
Toronto has recently been taking definite steps in regard to better housing. It is now nearly three years since the Toronto City Council, the Civic Guild, the Manufacturers' Association and the Board of Trade met and formed what is known as the Toronto Housing Company. The one idea of the organization was to make living conditions easier for those in humble circumstances. After considerable land had been purchased, not too far from the centre of the city,

the "cottage flat" type of building was decided upon. The cottage flat is a modern apartment with its own front door to the street. Each house contains two cottage flats, one downstairs and one upstairs. All the flats are heated by steam from a central plant which also furnishes hot water the year round. There are no dark or poorly ventilated rooms, because the buildings have free exposure on all sides, and all rooms are

outside rooms with no other buildings facing them to obstruct the light. The rentals range from fourteen dollars to twenty-five dollars a month, and include heat and hot water. Even with these low rentals the money invested pays six per cent. These model flats are proving such a success that they are springing up in many outlying wards, and the outlook is that within a few years' time the slums in the centre of Toronto will pretty well be abolished.

HIGHLANDERS LUCKY.  
Few Casualties Due to Their Good Behavior.

The good management of the 48th Highlanders is commented upon in a letter from Pte. Stuart James, of Toronto, writing from France as follows:—

"I am glad to say that our battalion has come off with very few casualties, which is due, I think, to good management and the behavior of the boys. At times we had some hard trials in the trenches, which were by no means very dry and most of the time very cold. It is no great fun when they are shelling you, and the best thing is to duck and take your chance of the shells throwing mud and sand bags into your face, while through it all we seem to keep up a good spirit, and only remark, 'That's a close one.' The third time in the trenches one shell landed right into our dugout. Then we had no home until we got busy and built it up again. You have read in the papers where the Germans destroyed churches and hospitals, and it is too true!"
