Port Traffic Here This Winter Expected To Reach High Level

Increased Service to Some Ports Noted in Sailing Lists Published

Every indication points to the 1926-'27 season being one of the best in the history of the port of Saint John for winter traffic, with an increased service to some ports, a direct line to Hamburg by the Thomson Line in addition to the Canadian Pacific lines continued service to that port, an increase in the Anchor-Donaldson an increase in the Anchor-Donaldson service to Scotland; an extension of the Canadian Government Merchant Marine; a probable increased service of the Head Line, as well as more sailings in the hadling of grain cargoes.

During the winter season of 1925-'26, the total number of regular passenger and freight sailings was 277 in comparison with 254 during 1924-'25, showing an increase of 23 ships for last ing an increase of 23 ships for last season, and from the present indications, the sailings for 1926-'27 should be larger than last season.

GRAIN LIKELY LARGER.

The carrying of grain cargoes alone should be larger than ever, owing to the large quantity that is expected to pass through the Canadian Pacific elevators on the western side of the har-bor, and the C. N. R. on the eastern The total number of ships carry ing only grain last season amounted t twelve or thirteen, but grain carriers this coming season will undoubtedly show a big increase, and several freight ers have already been chartered for this purpose


