IN COAL CRISIS
London, May 31—(By Canadian Press)—Following is a summary of Lloyd George's attitude on the coal strike as prepared by a London newspaper writer and based upon the British prime minister's recent speeches on the strike situation.

The first thing is to get rid of the notion that there are huge profits in the mines and that the grasping capitalists are trying to rob the miners of their share.

The mines are not paying because prices tumbled down suddenly.

If the price of home coal were increased the cost of every article would go up.

There is no conspiracy to reduce wages, but the taxpayers cannot be asked to contribute to keep up the wages of one industry.
