Y. W. P. A. ACTIVITIES

At the regular meeting of the Young Women's Patriotic Association held last evening in the G. W. V. A. rooms, Wellington Row, with Miss Jessie Church in the chair, Mrs. John McAvity and Miss Dorothy Jones demonstrated the nature, uses and peculiarities of the sphagnum moss and explained how it could be put to good advantage by the association. Specimens and views made the talk doubly interesting and clear to the listeners. Mrs. McAvity also reported on the matter of the Y. W. C. A. summer camp, which was moved that 200 copies of the Y. W. P. A. constitution be printed and distributed among the members. It was decided to hold two meetings a month throughout the summer instead of only one as in previous years. An appeal on behalf of a destitute returned soldier at hipman brought forth a donation of \$10. The president made known that 1 Red Cross work was to be handed in the end of each month in place of at a end of the summer. The sum of \$5 was voted to a party of First Continent men, who were returning overseas, secure smokers. A volunteer was asked to take charge of the Y. W. C. A.

It was made known at the meeting that preparations were all made for the picking of strawberries at Sackville; the season is to last twenty-two days. All the proceeds are for patriotic purposes.

The treasurer's report showed \$136.45 in the general fund; \$86.10 in the reserve fund, and \$34.50 in the Returned Soldiers' fund. A convener was appointed to have charge of the delicacies for patients in the Pitt street military hospital. An entertaining committee was appointed to look after outings for the returned soldiers during the summer months. Following the singing of the National Anthem the meeting adjourned.

KEPT SQUAD WORKING.

Young Girl Muniton Works Makes Record in Filling Grenades.

London, June 21.—A wonderful record in an important branch of war work has been made by Annie Irving, who is employed as a grenade filler in a munition filling district of London. In nine hours she filled 6,086 hand grenades with high explosives. Her score

during the first hour was fifty boxes of twelve grenades each, and gradually increasing her speed during the afternoon. she turned out a boxful each minute and for the last two hours more than a box a minute, or one grenade in less than five seconds. She was assisted by a squad of cementers, screwers-up, painters, packers and examiners.
