Health Minister to Recommend That Unpasteurized Milk be Permitted When it Conforms to Rigid Test—Letter to Mr. Riley.

In a letter to J. N. Riley, president of the St. John Milk Dealers' Association, Hon. Dr. W. F. Roberts made known his intention of bringing before the sub-district Board of Health a change in the pasteurization by-law by which unpasteurized milk might be sold in the city providing that it was of sufficiently good quality. He would recommend that the board pur-

a high standard on the milk and that all which failed to conform to this should be pasteurized. In an interview last night Dr. Roberts said that he was taking this step on account of the apparent antagonism to the law and not because his convictions of the good effects of pasteurization had been shaken. A meeting of the Board of Health is expected early next week and this suggestion of the Minister of Health will be heard then.


