The Guion line steamship Wyoming, which arrived at New York Wednesday, from Liverpool, reported that on Tuesday morning when 325 miles due east of Sandy Hook, she passed a vessel of about 120 tons burden, bottom up. The vessel's hull was painted red below, and green above the water line. She had evidently been capsized during the furious gales of Monday, as there were large quantities of new boards and vessel's gear floating near the wreck. Her crew were all probably drowned.

This answers the description of the schooner Holmes, Captain Lander, which it is thought has been lost. She sailed from this port six weeks ago to day for Boston, and has not been since heard from. The Holmes is 121 tons register.
