## BURNED BARK FOUND ON OCEAN

North Sydney, July 12.—The Newfoundland schooner Eremah, Captain Evans arrived in port today. Captain Evans reported having encountered a vessel on fire about 30 miles southeast of Flint Island and on investigation proved to be the abandoned Norwegian bark the Arizona. Captain Evans sent his mate and a sailor to see if any of the crew were on board, but they found the bark deserted. Her main and mizzen masts and rigging had been burned away and were hanging over her side. Her stern was ablaze and the fire was making its way towards the galley.

The Arizona was loaded with deals from a Bay Chaleur port for the United Kingdom when she encountered the full force of the heavy northeast gale on Thursday last off Cap North. She probably became unmanageable in the storm and was set on fire and abandoned by Captain Gunderson and his crew who then took to the boats. Captain Gunderson and his men landed at Ingonish Island yesterday morning in an exhausted condition and will probably reach here tomorrow. The Arizona was 1,032 tons register.

Six steamers were anchored in the stream off International Pier today awaiting cargoes of coal.
