a unique position—midway between the civilization of Europe and the Orient. When the Panama canal was opened there would be great changes on the Pacific coast.  
Christianity was exercising a great influence upon the Orient. Old religions were being broken down.  
Christianity was the only universal religion, the one one capable of satisfying the needs of the human heart. It might seem that they had embarked on a glorious undertaking, but if they believed in the reality of Christ's religion, and felt His spirit flooding their souls, they could achieve their purpose.

**Had Learned Lesson.**  
Empires in the past became possessed of selfishness, and passed away. But the people of Canada, and that a nation could maintain its position only by giving, and showing interests in all people.

**Sir Andrew Fraser.**  
Sir Andrew Fraser then gave some reminiscences of missionary work in India. In opening he spoke of seeing parties starting on pilgrimages to the shrine of the god Juggernaut, and seeing the same parties returning decimated by disease and troubled in spirit because of their failure to obtain a vision of the god. On one occasion a party of natives made a sacrifice to a locomotive hauling the commissioner's train. This was only one example of the darkness prevailing about a loving and lovable people.

The Christian churches should plan an adequate campaign of evangelization; the multitudes in darkness could not afford to wait.

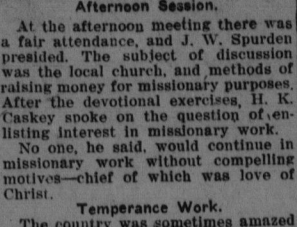
