Membership Boosted Yesterday by Adding 186 Names.

TODAY SEES END OF CANVASSING

Citizens Generally Showing Sympathy with Movement—Last Few Hours Expected to Bring Whirlwind Finish.

As a result of the board of trade's campaign yesterday 186 new members were added, bringing the list up to 1,225.

At the luncheon in Bond's press room Dr. Robinson announced that Bishop John LeBlanc had commended the movement.

H. P. Timmerman, industrial commissioner of the C. P. R., addressed the gathering and expressed approval.

W. H. Harrison reported for his committee that, in addition to eleven thousand dollars they had received a cheque for \$100.

Mr. Chase congratulated the committee and pointed out that they were the first to have a large number of members than is being done in a similar campaign this week in a section of the city of New York where in two weeks 100,000 members are being secured here yesterday. The fee there, however, is \$5.

He urged all the members of the committees to be at the board of trade rooms in time to start out before the noon hour.
