GALLANT ROUMANIAN ARMY COMPELS GERMAN FORCES TO RETIRE IN DISORDER

(Continued from page 1)
Russian Cavalry Wins.

Petrograd, July 27.—Russian cavalry threw back the pressing Austro-German infantry on Wednesday in the region southwest of Monastyrzyska. In Eastern Galicia, says the official statement issued today by the Russian war office.

The Russian announcement says the Austro-Germans have advanced towards the upper reaches of the Suchytsa river, and are consolidating their gains. The Roumanians took many prisoners and captured six guns.

Between the Dniester river and the Carpathians, the statement says, the Russians continue to retire in an easterly direction.

Southeast of Trembowla, in Galicia, near the Russian border, the Russians retired a short distance to new positions. The Austro-Germans have occupied the Galician towns of Plotyev and Crystylor, on the Sereth river.

The text of the Russian statement reads:

"Western (Russian) front: North of the Pripet river there have been fusillades, particularly animated between Smorzyn and Krevo. North of Tarnopol, the enemy has occupied Plotyev and Crystylor, on the Sereth. "His attacks southeast of Tarnopol, on the Lozova-Smykovec front, have been repulsed. Southeast of Trembowla, our troops retired a short distance eastward to new positions. Enemy attacks in the region of Tudorov, to the north of Cortikov, were repulsed by us.

"On Wednesday our cavalry had a series of successful encounters in the region of Korosiatin and Komarohka, to the southwest of Monastyrzyska, in which the enemy infantry which was passing them, was thrown back in a northwesterly direction. In the course of these cavalry attacks Col. Khesagoroff, the gallant commander of the Oestlinsky regiment, was killed.

Roumanians Advance.

"Between the Dniester and the Carpathians our troops continue to retire to the eastward.

"Roumanian front: The Roumanian troops advanced toward the upper reaches of the River Suchytsa, and are consolidating their positions. Advanced detachments moved forward upon the heights to the west of Sova and took many prisoners.

"In the course of the fighting yesterday the Roumanians captured many prisoners. They also took six machine guns, three machine guns, three mine throwers and a large quantity of stores and military material.

"Caucasus front: There was no change in the situation."

WILL VOTE ON PROHIBITION FOR THE U. S.

Senate at Washington Will Pass on Question Next Wednesday by Agreement.

Washington, July 27.—National prohibition will be voted on by the Senate next Wednesday. By unanimous consent it was agreed to take up Monday Senator Sheppard's resolution for a national prohibition amendment to the constitution and to dispose of it by Wednesday night.

Foes of prohibition consented to the vote in order to clear the resolution from the calendar, transmit it to the house and perhaps shift further agitation on the subject from Congress to the states. They agreed, however, that they would, however, for addition of a proviso requiring the states to act within six years on the constitutional amendment, if submitted to them.

FORMER ST. JOHN WOMAN IS DEAD

Mrs. Christopher Graham, Community Worker, Passes Away Suddenly.

July 27.—The sad news of the death of the young wife and mother, Mrs. Christopher Graham, sent a cloud of sorrow over Amherst today. A daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Murray of this town, Mrs. Graham was twenty-five years of age. For some time she was a prominent community worker in St. John, Halifax and other provincial centres. A few months ago she married in England Christopher Graham, a native of New Brunswick, and one of the first Y. M. C. A. workers to volunteer for service in France.

After spending some months in the old country Mrs. Graham returned to her home in Amherst. She was just recovering from her illness when she was seized with a short pain in the heart and expired in a few minutes. Her husband, Rev. Capt. Christopher Graham, and one young daughter, Jean, three brothers, Wilbur, in the West; Lloyd, in Antigonish, and Aubrey, in Amherst.
