DIGBY SENDS BACK THE COUNCILLORS WHO RESIGNED IN A BODY.

Nova Scotia Towns All Held Elections Tuesday—Truro's Interesting Contest—Amherst Has Its Youngest Mayor—Results in Many Places.

Digby, N. S., Feb. 3 (Special)—The largest vote ever polled in Digby was the result of today's election. It was as follows:— For one year—Van Blarcom, 139; Syda, 131; Treg, 137; Cousins, 75; Fairweather, 65; Smallie, 58.

Truro, N. S., Feb. 3 (Special)—One of the greatest fights in the election of town councillors in Truro closed this afternoon. The poll declared victory for the United Church Association. J. K. Fraser was elected by 27 majority, the total vote polled being 177. A. H. Learmont, 59; C. S. Haines, 77.

Amherst's Young Mayor. Amherst, N. S., Feb. 3 (Special)—Today witnessed the hottest fight for civic honors ever in Amherst. Councilor Charles A. Lundy defeated A. W. Moffatt by only five for the mayoralty. This is Mr. Moffatt's fourth defeat but he is not discouraged. Mr. Lundy being the only representative of the old council, had to fight against great odds. He has the honor of being the youngest mayor who ever presided over the affairs of Amherst, but, owing to his experience as deputy mayor has fitted him for the office. The vote stood: Lundy, 301; Moffatt, 296.
