From Yesterday's Second Edition. (Special Telegram to the Tribune.) The Dismissal of Officials.—The Late Appointments.—Sir John Macdonald Walks into the Ministry—Cogan's Resolution.

After recess from the evening was spent in discussing the question of the removal of officials, since the late appointments, on account of their opposing political candidates. It arose out of Mr. Mackenzie Bowell's resolution asking for correspondence respecting the dismissal of Dr. Strangé, of Kingston, for voting for Sir John Macdonald.

The Ministerialists argued that Dr. Strangé was merely a Battalion surgeon not having a commission, and, therefore, he could not be an official. The Opposition showed that Strangé's appointment was officially gazetted; therefore he was a Government official.

M. Dorion argued that his services were merely dispensed with; he was not dismissed. Attacks were made on the late Ministry for appointments made previous to their resignation.

Sir John replied in a masterly speech, showing that the English Governments have made important appointments after their resignation. Among such appointments he mentioned that of Earl Mayo as Viceroy of India at a salary of \$80,000.
