

1949, he retired from the Force. Two years later he reengaged as a special constable, receiving the bronze clasp and star to his Long Service Medal on January 1, 1956, and the silver clasp and star on October 23, 1957. He retired for the last time on December 31, 1959.

MACKAY Reg. No. 0.503, Supt. George McDonald Mackay (rtd.), 74, died on February 6, 1986, at Victoria, B.C. He was born on October 15, 1911, at Edinburgh, Scotland, and served with the Canadian Militia from 1928 to 1935 before joining the RCMP on June 26, 1935, at Edmonton, Alta. Following recruit training at Depot Division he was posted to Regina, "F" Division. For the next four years he performed general detachment duties in a variety of detachments in "F" Division, including Moose Jaw, Melville and Regina. On February 3, 1941, he transferred to Toronto, for work first as a drill instructor and mess caterer then later as NCO i/c Enemy Alien Registration Branch and i/c RCMP reserve investigations. He later served with the Toronto Detective Branch and after that as NCO i/c Toronto Town Station. On December 1, 1944, he was promoted to corporal and on October 1, 1949, to sergeant. On April 1, 1951, he was promoted to sergeant major and transferred to Fredericton, "J" Division. On August 21, 1953, he returned to Toronto as a drill instructor. Seven years later he was promoted to the rank of sub-inspector and transferred to "F" Division Headquarters as duty officer. Two years later he was made full inspector. On July 3, 1963, he was transferred to "E" Division in order to take over command of Victoria Sub-Division. On May 6, 1967, he took over temporary command of "P" Division, Penhold, Alta. He was promoted to superintendent on September 1, 1967. Upon the closing of "P" Division, he was transferred to Victoria "E" Division to assume the duties of administrative officer. On June 26, 1970, he retired to pension.

MAKINSON Reg. No. 9994, ex-Sgt. George Tingley Makinson, 82, died on February 18, 1986, at Makinsons, Nfld. He was born on December 23, 1903, and joined the Force on September 5, 1923, at Halifax, N.S. He served in Winnipeg, Man.; Bache Peninsula, N.W.T.; Vancouver, B.C.; Edmonton, Alta.; Depot Division; Regina, Sask.; "N" Division, Ottawa, and Swift Current, Sask. He retired from the Force as a sergeant on September 3, 1943.

McKAY Reg. No. 16794, ex-S/Sgt. John Barron McKay, 58, died on February 23, 1986, in Ottawa, Ont. He was born on November 4, 1927, at Collingwood, Ont., and joined the RCMP on December 18, 1950, at Winnipeg, Man. Following recruit training at "N" and Depot Division he was posted to Vancouver, "E"

Division. He also worked in Cloverdale before being returned east to HQ Division for work with "C" Directorate, Special Branch, on January 5, 1953. On May 1, 1961, he was promoted to corporal. He spent the rest of his career at HQ Division, serving first in "I" Directorate, "A" Branch, then the Central Research Branch and later in Planning and Coordination, Security Service. He was promoted to sergeant on May 1, 1964, and staff sergeant on November 1, 1966. He retired on May 20, 1980.

McKAY Reg. No. 16484, ex-Sgt. Roy Gordon McKay, 66, died on March 21, 1986, at New Westminster, B.C. He was born on January 6, 1920, at Victoria, B.C. and served with the British Columbia Provincial Police for four years becoming a member of the RCMP on June 20, 1946, at Victoria, B.C., when the two forces were amalgamated. He spent his entire service in "E" Division, serving at Burnaby, Trail and Maillardville Detachments. He was promoted to corporal on November 1, 1957, and sergeant on May 1, 1966. He retired from the Force on September 19, 1971.

MONRO Reg. No. 10715, ex-Cpl. Arthur Monro, 82, died on February 26, 1986, at Parksville, B.C. He was born on February 1, 1904, at Belfast, Ireland, and served with the British Imperial Army for three years before joining the RCMP on October 1, 1929, at Winnipeg, Man. He spent seven years of his service with the Force in the North: two years at Bache Peninsula, two years at Lake Harbour, two years as NCO i/c at Fort Norman and one year at Resolution, N.W.T. On September 1, 1940, he transferred to Depot Division. He also worked in "F" Division, as NCO i/c Herbert Detachment, and in "N" Division. On November 1, 1945, he was promoted to corporal. He was invalided to pension on December 12, 1947.

MURTON Reg. No. 12638, ex-Sgt. James Edward Murton, 75, died on March 22, 1986, at Vancouver, B.C. He was born on May 8, 1910, at Plymouth, England, and joined the RCMP on June 26, 1935, at Winnipeg, Man. He served first with the Mounted Section, Vancouver, "E" Division and then with the Drug Squad in the same city. On February 7, 1942, he was transferred to Grand Forks and on December 30, 1944, to Abbotsford. He served in both detachments as NCO i/c. His next posting was to C.I.B. Vancouver. Three years later he was promoted to corporal. He stayed there for the rest of his career. On November 1, 1954, he was promoted to sergeant. He retired from the Force on June 25, 1955.

NIEDZWIECKI Reg. No. 0.698, Supt. Albert Joseph Niedzwiecki (rtd.), 58, died on November 23, 1985, near Princeton, B.C. He was born on April 2, 1927, at Huntsville, Ont., and joined
