Emigrated to California in 1856 and thence to B. C. in 1858, and settled in Nanaimo in 1861. M., 3 Sept., 1864, Emma Elizabeth, eldest dau. of James Robb, Esq., J.P. of Comox, (she d. 15 Feb. 1882); 2nd, 15 June 1886, Statira Katherine, youngest dau. of Joseph Shepard, Esq., of Lansing, Yonge Street, Ont. Is a builder by trade. Was an unsuccessful candidate for Nanaimo in Leg. Assem., B.C., at g.e. 1876, and on the resignation of the sitting men., John Bryden, was elected in June 1877. Sat two sessions, and was one of the Committee that arranged the Order of Business, which terminated the dead lock in the Assem. 1878. Was an unsuccessful candidate for same seat at g.e. 1878, and an unsuccessful candidate for present seat in the Commons at g.e. 1878. First returned to the Commons, 4 Aug. 1882. Re-elected at g.e. 1887 and 1891. A Liberal Conservative and opposed to Chinese immigration. Was chiefly instrumental in inducing the Elliott Government in B.C. to carry through the Assem. the Bill known as "The Coal Mines Regulations Act, 1877." —*Nanaimo, B.C.*

GRIEVE, JAMES NICOL. (*North Perth.*)

Parents were natives of Scotland. B. 17 July, 1855, in the Tp. of Mornington, and ed. at the Common School there. M., Ella O. F. Hutchison, of Co. Waterloo. A farmer. Is Deputy Reeve of Mornington; and a director of the Elma Fire Insur. Co., and of the Farmer's Institute, N.R. Perth. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Liberal. —*Millbank, Ont.*

B. in 1846 at St. Philomène, Co. of Chateauguay. Ed. at St. Sulpice Coll., St. Thérèse de Blainville Little Seminary and Laval Univ. M., in 1873, second dau. of the late George Pelletier, Esq., merchant, of Fraserville. First returned to Parlt. at g.e., 1878; re-elected at g.e. 1882, 1887 and 1891. Apptd. Deputy Speaker and Chairman of Committees of the House of Commons, 29 April, 1891. A Conservative. —*River du Loup, (en bas) P. Q.*

GUAY, PIERRE MALCOLM, M.D. (*Lévis.*)
