Was employed on the London and Birmingham, North Midland, London and Blackwall, and other Railways in Eng. during their construction. Came to Can., 1847. Was Engineer to the Co. York, Ont. Designed the Toronto University, and other public edifices in Ont. Represented Can. at the Exhibition of All Nations in London, 1851, and was Secy. of the Provincial Industrial Commission on that occasion. One of the originators of the Canadian Institute, Toronto, of which he has been Vice-President. Has been Presdt. of the St. George's Society Toronto. Is a mem. of the Council of the University of Trinity College, same city, and a director of the Rama Timber Transportation Co. Organized the 10th (Royals) V. M. during the "Trent Difficulty," in 1861, of which he was Lt.-Col. from that time until he retired some years afterwards.
