

Sec 56. - Disallowance by Order in Council of Act assented to by Govt Genl. - send copy of bill above to Secy of State 3 years allowed for disallowance. Govt Genl by speech or message to recommend disallowance or by proclamation annul such act.

Sec 57. Signification of Queen's pleasure on reserved bill. Without the force of Govt Genl's assent as receipt of Queen's assent to bill within 2 years. An entry of such speech, message or proclamation in journals of House, and a duplicate delivered to officer to be kept among the records of Canada.

substitutes Govt Genl. for the Queen. (see 1870) Blake & Jno. Macdonald held the correct view (see correspondence in sessional papers of 1870 & 1874-1875) There is nothing in the BNA. to justify Her Majesty on advice of her Ministers to disallow provincial acts. What is the policy of disallowance? This is not an arbitrary power. This power exists to be used for certain constitutional purposes. The Council of the Empire is an unformulated unsystematized federal organization. The Imp. Govt has power to disallow certain acts, how does it exercise this. It reserves to itself the right to legislate on certain domestic affairs. It deals with all questions of foreign affairs & rights and duties of Empire re foreign countries and if and policy encroached on then former the Imp Govt would disallow the act. When the Imp Govt confers right of self gov't on a colony it as a matter of fact abstains from interfering with local affairs, not because it can't
