Dear Mr. Meighen:

I have your letter of the 18th. instant with enclosure, and I enjoyed it tremendously. I am looking forward with interest to its publication in the "Leader-Post". I do not see how they can refuse to publish it.

The Editor of the "Leader-Post" is David Rogers, a brother of the late Norman Rogers. In the whole of Canada there has been no editorial writer so faithful an apologist for the Government as he has been. From his pen there has not come one word which might be considered as critical of any Governmental policy. He has been fed, as has been the public, on eulogies of Ministers of the Government and wild expositions of Governmental policy. He delights to indulge in personalities and during the last election campaign, for instance, devoted one editorial to me which was styled "Buzzard" and he undertook to prove that that was what I was, and all because I had the temerity to criticize Government policy. Last May I wrote the only letter I ever addressed to the editor, a two-column letter in which I went after him and the Government as hard as I could. It was a very weak response he made, but personally I never had such a response to anything as to that letter. Hundreds called me up, at least half of whom were
