of fifty chains South on the said line between 19th thirty five and thirty-six from the line between questive and six you will please plant a post on the East side of the road allowance marking the limit between cons four and five.

The usual plan field notes and report will be required. The plan should be prepared on a scale of forty chains to an inch and should include your recent survey of Burnt Island and the adjoining shore line. All the areas of lots should be shown on the plan together with all measurements takes and bearing; along the shore line show the road allowance one chain wide.

usual manner; blank books for use in the field and for the final copy for the Department will be forwarded to you. The traverse should be made on tracing cloth on a scale of ten chains to an inch on separate sheets each sheet containing a convenient distance. The said sheets are to be pasted in the end of the field books.

cedar, or of the most durable wood to be obtained in the locality. They should be five inches square and four and a half feet long, pointed at one end, and bevelled at their heads; the numbers of the adjoining concessions or lots should be cut deeply into them with a sharp knife and the letter "R" on the side or sides facing the road allowances. Where ever reasonably possible posts are to be mounded with stones, if these can be obtained within a reasonable distance, or with earth, in order that should fire occur their positions can be readily found. The report should be in the max form of an ordinary letter and sent as usual
