In reply to your letter of the lith instant, with enclosures, I beg to say that some time ago Windblow Clipps with his wife and son, Thomas Windblow Clipps made application to be placed on the pay-hist of the Chippewa Band of Walpole Island, and recognized as members of that band. The privilege was accorded to the two older persons, but owing to the character which the son is stated to bear say he was not accepted into the band. The Indian Agent was advised to this effect. The Department has now written Thomas Windblow Clipps advising him that the decision arrived at in the uniter settled the case.
