

- Q.11 Did you see a pack in the room?  
 A.11 No sir.  
 Q.12 Where did the cigarettes come from the accused gave you?  
 A.12 I don't know sir, I thought they came out of his kit bag.  
 Q.13 Where did he pick them up from immediately before he gave them to you?  
 A.13 I did not see sir, I was not in the room.  
 Q.14 How many were on the bed were there many?  
 A.14 Quite a few sir.  
 Q.15 How many cigarettes were you given by the accused?  
 A.15 75 sir.  
 Q.16 What did you do with them?  
 A.16 I smoked two packages and gave one to my girl friend.  
 Q.17 Do you know what happened to that package you gave to your girl friend?  
 A.17 Yes sir, the M.P.s went up and got them

Cross examined by the Defense

- Q.18 Were you present when the M.P.s got the package from your girl friend?  
 A.18 No sir.  
 Q.19 You don't really know that they got them there?  
 A.19 The said they did.  
 Q.20 How many other people slept in the room at Columbia house?  
 A.20 Four sir, six altogether.  
 Q.21 Can you definitely state that Norland had cigarettes with him when he went on leave?  
 A.21 Yes sir, we both got cigarettes the night before we left on leave.

Questioned by the court

- Q.22 You remember pretty well the night this alleged theft took place?  
 A.22 Yes sir.  
 Q.23 What was the last time on that day or evening you saw the accused?  
 A.23 About 11 o'clock in the morning.  
 Q.24 When did you see him again?  
 A.24 When I woke up the next morning, a little before eight o'clock.  
 Q.25 Was the accused in his bed at that time?  
 A.25 Yes sir.  
 Q.26 Was your bed adjoining the bed of the accused?  
 A.26 I was on top he was below  
 Q.27 When you woke up in the morning did you notice any such pack as the one on the chair close to the accused's bed?  
 A.27 No sir.
