KLAHOOSE TRIBE NEW WESTMINSTER AGENCY.

I did not have the chance to visit the reserves of the Klahoose tribe but I am of the opinion that they have a sufficient acreage of reserves to their credit, but recommend that all foreshores, be included as being part and parcel of their reserves.

Their principle demands at present are for the relaxation of the timber regulations, so that they would be permitted to cut and sell their timber without any restriction, and then eventually clear their reserves of arable nature for garden purposes.

Another of their principle requirements is that they have unlimited rights to take fish, which will be dealt with in the future together with the other tribes of B.C.

I may say that this tribe, with the Sliammon, and Homalco tribes are in accord with the all the policies of the organised Allied Tribes of B.C.
