

And having regard to the importance of the
land where the said Indians are now settled
in respect of the purposes of the Navigation of
the said River and transport in connection
therewith, and otherwise, and in view of the fact
that many of the said Indians have now houses
and Gardens on the other side of the River, ^{and elsewhere} which
they will abandon, His Majesty agrees through His
Said Commissioners to grant a sum of
Five Hundred dollars to the said Band to be
paid in equitable proportions to such of them as
have houses, to assist them in removing their
houses to the said Reserve, or building other,
And the said Indians represented herein by their
Chief and Councillors, presented as such by the
Band, do hereby agree to accept the several
provisions, payments, and other benefits as stated
in the said treaty, and ^{promise} solemnly and engage to abide
by, carry out and fulfil all the stipulations,
obligations and conditions therein contained,
on the part of the said Chiefs and Indians
therein named, to be observed and performed,
And in all things to conform to the articles of
the said Treaty, as if we ourselves had been
originally
