Afghan Treaty Published.

London, May 25.—An authorized translation of the new treaty between Great Britain and Afghanistan is published. In the treaty Haibat Khan, the ameer, renounces the pledges given by his father, Abdur Rahman Khan, and the British Government renounces the engagements entered into with the late ameer.

"The Russian cavalry on the right bank of the Liao River" commenced a retreat on the morning of May 22, and at 5 o'clock in the afternoon the enemy had reached a point south of Tatum which lies seventeen miles west of Faku-man."

Japs Had to Get Out.

St. Petersburg, May 25.—Gen. Linevitch, under date of May 23, reports that a Russian detachment successfully attacked the Japanese trenches on the heights north of the station of Changtufu May 21, forcing the Japanese to evacuate their trenches.

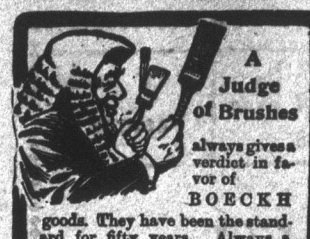
"There is so much bad in the best of us and so much good in the worst of us that it behooves each one of us to be charitable to the rest of us."
