Mr. Duthie paid 45 gns. for "Spicy Quadrant," got by Paragon Baron. The eighty-eight females averaged 433, and fifteen bulls averaged 435.

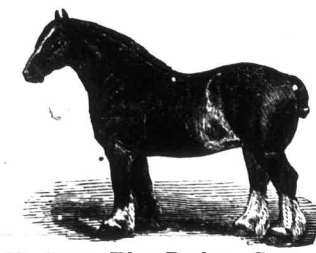

The reason that led him to this conclusion is their quiet disposition and quick maturing qualities. SALE OF MR. T. D. HODGENS THOROUGHBREDS AND TROTTERS.

A company of some two hundred gathered on the Western Fair grounds, London, on Tuesday, 24th ult., to witness the dispersion of Mr. T. D. Hodgens' thoroughbreds, with a draft of trotting-bred colts and fillies added, the whole making an attractive offering. The thoroughbred brood mares which Mr. Hodgens has gathered together represent some of the stoutest running strains on the continent, and the fact that the stud has been successful in producing a large number of winners of late years, together with the size and beauty of many of the individuals, made them a most desirable foundation for those starting a breeding establishment. Although competition was far from keen, still good paying prices were realized. The highest sum reached was when the grand old brood mare, Curtillina, by Judge Curtis, was knocked down at \$480.00, but at this price she was doubtless a bargain, as she has already produced two good ones in Kite String, by imp. Strachino, which won the Queen's Plate as a three-year-old, and which is doubtless one of the best ever bred in this stud, while Jardine, another from Curtillina, has won some good events through last summer meetings. Curtillina is now in foal to Dandie Diamond, and should produce a star from this cover. The beautiful chestnut yearling filly, Middledens, by Dandie Diamond, out of Maggie Bruce, sold at \$110.00. Lou Daly, a strong, handsome three-year-old filly, by imp. Newcourt, dam out of Lady Lucy, by imp. Kyrl Daly, brought \$50.00. Rosa Daly, a grand big, well-developed two-year-old filly, by Kedar Khan, from the same dam, sold at \$35.00. Alberta, yet another from Lady Lucy, a 4-year-old, by imp. Albert, a bit plain in her make-up, brought \$20. Strathlene, a strong, useful seven-year-old mare, by imp. Strachino, dam Tolima, by Glen Athol, sold at \$25.00. Several weanlings sold from \$90.00 to \$100.00, and one over this. In all, 18 thoroughbreds were offered, but several were passed. Among those which did not find a purchaser was the beautiful nine-year-old stallion Cortez; he is a dark chestnut of good size and very smooth finish. He has shown himself to possess both speed and stoutness in a number of strongly contested events. Trotting blood did not appear to meet with as good a demand, which may be accounted for by the fact that this portion of the offering was a draft from Mr. Hodgens' large stud of this breeding, and although there was a number of promising young things, still they failed to bring paying prices.
