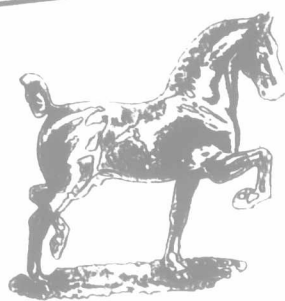

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS. Veterinary.

WEAK KNEES.

Three-year-old colt that has never been driven, is exercised in a yard night and morning, and tied in a stall with plank floor, shows signs of knee-sprung.

Ans.—There is doubtless a congenital weakness in the knees, and the exciting cause is standing too much in the stable, probably in a stall high in front. Keep him in a box stall and feed off the floor. If compelled to keep tied in a single stall, see that the stall floor is level, or about level; remove mangers and feed off the floor. Some recommend shoeing with high-heel calkins, but I prefer the treatment advised. Applications do no good.

LAMENESS—ITCHY LEGS.

1. While drawing logs with a three-year-old colt, he went lame on one hind leg. He stands sound and is very little lame when walking, but when trotted he goes sideways and drags the foot.

2. Mare has itchy legs and the hair is falling out.

Ans.—1. The symptoms indicate hip-joint lameness, which is very hard and tedious to treat. He must have a long rest. Get a blister made of two drams each of cantharides and biniodide of mercury, mixed with two ounces vaseline. Clip the hair off the joint. Tie so he cannot bite the part. Rub the blister in well once daily, for two days. On the third day apply sweet oil and turn him in a box stall. Oil every day. As soon as the scale comes off, blister again, and after this blister once every four weeks until lameness disappears.

2. Purge with 8 drams aloes and 2 drams ginger. Follow up with 1½ ozs. Fowler's Solution of Arsenic twice daily for a week. Dress the legs twice daily with a solution of corrosive sublimate 40 grains to a quart of water.

CRIPPLED PIG—PINWORMS.

1. Pig, seven months old, has been crippled for a month. He has no use of his fore legs, and lately abscesses have formed and broken on his legs and lower part of his shoulder.

2. Nine-months-old colt has pinworms.

Ans.—1. This crippling is due to high feeding and want of exercise, and the abscesses are the result of bruising of the tissues in lying so much and vain attempts to rise. Flush out the cavities of the abscesses three times daily with a warm 5-per-cent. solution of carbolic acid in water, until healed. In the meantime keep well bedded. Purge with 4 ozs. raw linseed oil, and follow up with 5 grains nux vomica twice daily. Feed on milk, bran and raw roots, and as soon as he can rise, see that he gets regular exercise.

2. Clean out the rectum by injecting a gallon of warm, soapy water. When this has been expelled, inject a quart of raw linseed oil and ½ oz. oil of turpentine.

LAME MARE.

Mare has been lame for seven weeks. At first the cords above the fetlock were swollen. I bathed them and applied liniment and she got better and went sound for a time. Then she got so lame she could hardly stand over in the stall. I blistered her two weeks ago and she is some better now, but stands with ankle cocked, and puts little weight upon the foot. This is the off fore leg. Two weeks ago, when rising, she hurt her near stifle, and she is lame on that leg and there is a soft lump near the flank. Is there a cap on the stifle? I have concluded the coffin joint is the seat of lameness in front.

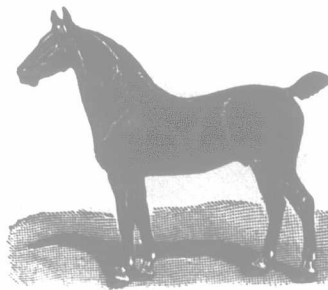

Ans.—Coffin-joint lameness does not cause the acute lameness and other symptoms you give. The trouble is in or about the fetlock joint. Blister again, and, if necessary, repeat in about three weeks. In the meantime, of course, give her perfect rest, and if possible put her in a roomy, well-bedded box stall. Also blister the stifle. If the lump you mention near the stifle is puffy, it is doubtful whether you will succeed in removing it. There is a cap on stifle-bone in front of stifle-joint.
