



### CHRONIC BRONCHITIS.

Bronchitis is an inflammation of the mucous membrane of the bronchial tubes, and is one of the most common of the pulmonary affections. Chronic bronchitis more often occurs later in life. Persons thus afflicted are very liable to take a cold, at which time the mucus becomes clear and frothy, and it is not uncommon the case that the patient dies in one of those attacks.
