“AT the Provincial Parliament begun and holden at *Quebec*, the twenty fourth day of January, *Anno Domini* one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven, in the thirty seventh Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Third, by the Grace of GOD, of *Great Britain, France and Ireland* KING, Defender of the Faith, &c.

And from thence continued by several Prorogations to the fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred, being the fourth Session of the second Provincial Parliament of LOWER-CANADA.

WHEREAS an Act paſſed in the thirty third year of His Maſteſty's Reign, intituled, “*An Act to provide Returning Officers for Knights, Citizens and Burgeſſes to ſerve in Aſſembly,*” has been by ſeveral Acts continued to the firſt day of January in this preſent year, and from thence to the end of the preſent Session of the Provincial Parliament at which time it will expire; and Whereas it is neceſſary to make further and more ample Proviſion, reſpecting Returning Officers and regulating the Elections of Knights, Citizens and Burgeſſes to ſerve in Aſſembly, Be it therefore enacted by the King's Moſt Excellent Maſteſty, by and with the advice and conſent of the Legiſlative Council and Aſſembly of the Province of Lower Canada, conſtituted and aſſembled by virtue of
