POLICE COURT

Interesting Cases Heard by Magistrate Livingston This Morning

How much booze can a foreigner keep in his house legally? Magistrate Livingston had to settle it today, and he did so \$100 strong against a local foreigner.

Joseph Rohack's case was a lengthy one. Mr. Woodruff appeared for defendant and Mr. Hollinrake for the license inspector. It was a question of whether the amount of beer which went into Rohack's house at 39 Pearl street was more than could reasonably be consumed by his own family. His Worship thought that the evidence showed more than this amount had gone to the house. Hence Rohack was guilty of selling liquor. He was fined \$100 and costs. "This is quite too frequent among the foreigners," said Inspector Eccart, "and I think this will be a lesson."
