Strike Is at End

By Courier Leased Wire. Vancouver, June 4.—Following a conference which lasted several hours here last night the agreement between the shipyard workers and the shipbuilders was signed and the recent strike is now recorded as a thing of the past. Up to the very last the boiler-makers refused to sign the agreement, but will return to work at least until August 1. Food worth \$1,000,000, totalling 277,000 pounds, was destroyed or wasted in Montreal in fifteen months through being kept in storage till it rotted.
