The weather cannon have been in ise for about two years in Northern Italy as well as in parts of Spain and Southern France. The idea originated in the French republic, where winemakers near Marseilles discovered that the rapid discharge of a field piece tended to ward off hailstorms.

The barrel is constructed of sheet ron about one-fourth of an inch in thickness at the top, the plates being closely riveted together. At the bottom the thickness of the barrel is about half an inch. The barrel is set in a steel framework, which contains the orifice for the cartridge.
