DECISIONS RENDERED

Lower Dominion Claims Are Involved

Question as to Length of Claims Difficult to Solve, Original Posts Gone.

A couple of decisions recently rendered in the gold commissioner's court will be of interest to the mining public, one in particular, effecting the title to the ground adjoining 232 below lower on Dominion on the right limit.

the claim, from which it is assumed the locator would stake. "I have come to the conclusion from the general appearance of the post produced in court, from the fact that it is approximately the length of a claim from the posts shown on Mrs. Kaiser's plan a short distance below the lower line of No. 231, from the fact that from this post to the next original post below that is identified, namely, the location post between 234 and 235, is only a distance of 622 feet, (within this distance two claims purporting to be 500 feet in length were staked.)"

The second decision referred to is in the case between Ole Ackerson, Albert Appelquist and Auguste St. Onge and Wm. E. Haddock, and is over the hillside adjoining the lower half, right limit, of 54 and 55 below on Bonanza and the benches contiguous.

"The plaintiffs are the owners of the hillside claim described as adjoining the lower half, right limit, of No. 54 below discovery on Bonanza creek, staked on the 27th and recorded on the 29th of July, 1898. The defendant Haddock staked a fractional claim that he states lies between creek claim No. 54 and the hill claim above described, and recorded February 11th, 1902. Mr. Jepsen, D.L.S., made a survey of this fractional claim on February 17th. The evidence as to the original position of the down hill posts of the hill claim in question is conflicting, and it is very difficult to come to a satisfactory conclusion as to where these posts were originally placed, but the prior location was staked nearly four years before this fractional piece of ground, and the owners thereof have done most of their work since their location was recorded within the piece of ground in dispute; and as in the Gillespie case, I am of opinion that before a fractional piece of ground should be allowed to a locator between a creek claim and a hill claim that is assumed to be adjoining the creek claim, the evidence must be of such a character that there is no doubt that the fractional claim exists there, and that the locator is not in any way interfering with established rights. I am by no means satisfied in this case that Haddock was justified in staking this piece of ground. I think the plaintiffs are entitled to succeed, and the survey of the fractional claim in question made by Mr. Jepsen should be disallowed."
