This law has in part been effectua in stopping this wanton destruction of an ever welcome guest, but only in part as we learn that during this present season almost every bird's nest in the vicinity of Wolfville has been hunted out and the eggs taken therefrom by youths and boys who should know better. We are glad to know that the S. P. C. is determined to prevent this ruthless destruction of our feathered friends and have offered a reward to the person or persons who will give such information as will lead to the convic tion of any person found guilty of kill ing birds or destroying their eggs of young. The law provides a severe pen alty, and the offence certainly merits i We trust that every effort will be put forth to protect the birds, and secur the punishment of those who are want only destroying them.
