Voices From Nova Scotia

J. K. Fleming is a convicted grafter. He was found guilty by a royal commission on which his own political friends were in the majority. He was forced to re-

sign the Premiership of New Brunswick because he was a convicted grafter. Later on, he was nominated for Ottawa by the Conservative-Nationalists of Carleton. Mr. Carvell conducted the case against Fleming, and obtained a verdict of guilty. Mr. Carvell has conducted cases against other political grafters besides Fleming, and verdicts of guilty were the result. Against Mr. Carvell himself no single charge of dishonesty has ever been made. His life has been without stain or graft.—Amherst Guardian.

Of the Carleton county campaign the Halifax Chronicle says: "The campaign has been a very bitter and exciting one; the Opposition put up a vigorous fight and deserved to win. But they were not able to overcome the personal strength of the Government conjoined with the forces of evil arrayed against them. But although Carleton county has been held by a reduced majority for a discredited government, we refuse to believe that the people of New Brunswick will condone the scandals which have disgraced the province."

WHY CONSCRIPTION?

Because it is the only fair scheme.

It is estimated the maritime provinces have a total of males of service age 161,927. The apportionment of these required to fulfil the Government's promise would be 65,000.

The enlistments up to June 1, were 31,961.

This leaves to be recruited 34,939.

Suppose it were possible to find this number willing to enlist; it would simply paralyze every known industry, destroy its value, and leave many out of employment, because every factory and establishment has certain overhead expenses which it cannot get away from, and it cannot get enough volume of business, from the fact of not enough output on account of not enough help, the manager usually hears a whisper from his banker.

This is really what would happen if 35,000 more males were taken out of the Maritime Provinces in the voluntary hap-hazard method. But suppose a selection could be made for younger men, of which, as shown, there are 161,937 serviceable. Does this not sound much more reasonable to the young men themselves, as well as the country.




