The exception is an American citizen.

WILL ATTEMPT TO BLOCKADE ITALY

New York, Sept. 3.—Austria-Hungary shortly will attempt a submarine blockade against Italy identical with the one that has been attempted with so little success by Germany against Great Britain.

This was the word brought here today by passengers on the Italian liner Tomaso di Savoia. The Adriatic sea and that portion of the Mediterranean adjacent to Italy will be included in the war zone which the Austrians will declare and in which they will attempt to operate.

London, Sept. 3.—The German and Austrian armies on the eastern front are about to part company, according to a dispatch to the Exchange Telegraph company from Amsterdam. This quote a message from Vienna announcing that Field-Marshal Archduke Frederick, commander-in-chief of the Austrian armies, today bade official farewell to Field-Marshal von Mackensen, the German commander at Brest Litovsk, as henceforth the armies of the two commanders were to cease co-operating.

The message says it is believed the Austrian armies that have been operating in Poland shortly will be removed in the direction of Serbia.

NANAIMO TENNIS CLUB WON MATCH

A most enjoyable tennis match took place yesterday afternoon on the grounds of the Nanaimo Tennis Club, between the members of the club and others, the others consisted of some members of the Departure Bay, Ladysmith and some ladies and gentlemen of the city and Garrison.

The match was played on the system of 12 games to a set. Twenty-one sets in all were played including ladies' doubles, mixed doubles, and concluding with three single sets. The games, which were played under perfect weather conditions were characterized by great enthusiasm and viewed by many interested spectators. Tea and refreshments were served on the grounds. The result of the match was 148 to 104 in favor of the Nanaimo Club.

UP ISLAND LOST TO VICTORIA CRICKETERS

Under the auspices of the Red Cross Society a very successful cricket match was played at Duncan yesterday between a side captained by Mr. H. R. Orr and a side composed of Cowichan and Nanaimo players captained by Mr. Balis.

The weather was ideal for cricket and quite a number of Cowichan people turned out to see the game. The Victoria aggregation proved altogether too strong for the players of the local clubs. They had quite a relay of useful bowlers and were particularly strong in batting with the result that they more than doubled the score of the allied team, the totals being 251 to 111.

THE LEADERS IN THE BIG LEAGUES

Chicago, Sept. 4.—Batting averages today showed that Ty. Cobb has recovered from his recent slump and is still leading the American league batters with .375. During his slump the Detroit star failed to get a hit in nineteen times up. Detroit leads in batting with .270. Cobb leads in stolen bases with 78, but has lost the total base lead to Crawford with 240. Cobb is the best run-maker with 120. Burns of Detroit continues in front with five home runs. Foster of Boston leads the 500 pitchers with eighteen wins and five losses. Luderus of Philadelphia batted himself into the National league lead with .326 in the week. St. Louis leads in club batting with .257. Cravath, Philadelphia, secured 74 runs, 208 bases and 13 home runs, leading in each department. Carey, of Pittsburgh, leads the base-stealers with thirty.

Mammaux, of Pittsburgh with nineteen wins and six losses, heads the 500 pitchers who have worked in 20 or more games.

In the Federal league, Kauff, of Brooklyn, has the batting honors with .343. Brooklyn leads the club batting with .270. Berghammer, of Pittsburgh, brought in seventy-eight runs, putting him at the head of the list. Konetchy leads with 232 bases. Chase, of Buffalo with 13 homers, leads that division, and Kauff is the leading base-stealer with 42. Reulbach of Newark, has 16 wins and 7 defeats, putting him in front of the pitchers.

GIVE O'LEARY DECISION IN BOUT WITH H. McDONALD

Vernon, B. C., Sept. 3. — Johnny O'Leary, the lightweight champion of Canada, was given a newspaper decision over Hector McDonald at the conclusion of a sensational 10-round bout before a capacity house here today. At no stage of the game was O'Leary in danger and it was McDonald's good work at covering up that killed Johnny's chances for a knockout. The lightweight champion gave an exhibition of pretty boxing and put over some new stuff. His right crosses reached the mark on many occasions and sent the other man staggering. O'Leary leaves tomorrow for Calgary, where at the encampment on the Sarcee Reserve, near the prairie city, he will meet the champion of the troops there at an early date.

NEW MOTORCYCLE RECORD
New York, Sept. 4.—Arthur Chaple made a new motorcycle record for one mile at the Brighton Beach motor-drome when he raced around the wooden track in 37 4-5, one-fifth of a second lower than the previous track record for the distance, which he made last year.
