Markets and Finance
Toronto Sunday Times.—While the position of the banks is probably better than a few weeks ago, extreme caution is still the order of the day. Loans on stocks are as difficult to negotiate as ever, as banks are nursing their reserves in anticipation of the crop moving season. The prices of securities, while steady in many cases show no disposition to advance. This kind of speculation is discouraged, and an immediate prospect of a rise is one of the things not considered at the present time. An upward movement in stocks depends solely upon the money market which is still adverse to such a movement.
