Synopsis of Canadian North-west Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a fam- ily, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The application must appear in per- son at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub- Agency of the district. Entry by proxy will be made at the discretion of the Agency.

Duties - Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a regular or casual basis, solely owned and occupied by him or by his wife, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain conditions a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead at the price of \$200 per acre. Duties - Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including time spent on a regular or casual basis) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted the homestead right and cannot pre-empt may take a purchased homestead in certain circumstances. Price \$2.00 per acre. Duties - Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.00.

THE KING CAN DO NO WRONG

The Common Custom of Misapplying This Familiar Phrase.

It is astonishing how frequently the familiar phrase, "the king can do no wrong," is misapplied. It is supposed to be the motto of an unlimited despotism and in some way associated with the doctrine of the divine right of kings. Representative Fowler uses the phrase in this sense in his recent attack on the speaker of the House. Nothing could be further from the real meaning of the phrase. It is the symbol of a system to which the sovereign reigns but does not rule. No where can it be more fittingly applied than to the English Government. The king can do no wrong simply because it is his ministers who do right or wrong, and when the people are dis- satisfied with the ministers they change them, not him. He simply expresses the will of the dominant party. During her protracted reign Queen Victoria changed parties a half a score of times; not because she changed her mind, but because she was the simple mouthpiece of the party that happened to be in power. President Taft can do wrong, because his cabinet according to the theory of the constitution, are merely secretaries who follow his instructions and carry his will into effect. If they do wrong he is responsible for it, for he can displace them at any moment. He has absolute executive power, only partially modified by the possible sena- torial action. It was for attempting to exercise this undoubted constitu- tional right that an enraged congress sought the impeachment of Andrew Johnson. Fortunately seven Republican senators helped defeat this revolution- ary measure. Although they were politically slaughtered, the right of the president to control his cabinet has never been seriously called in question. In England it is said that the lord chancellor is the "keeper of the king's conscience." If this had referred to his private and personal ethics there have been English monarchs who would have made his lordship's office no sinecure! But, of course, it only has to do with the sovereign's political duties and responsibilities. Happy the land in which the "king can do no wrong" and where the king is carefully instructed official to keep the royal con- science in a sound condition of political health.

The Housekeeper

DEVIL'S FOOD.

Put on stove one-half cupful of sugar; beat one egg; one-half cupful of milk, two squares of chocolate. Let boil. Set aside to cool. One cupful of sugar, one-half cupful of butter, one-half cupful of sweet milk, two eggs, one teaspoonful of vanilla, one and three-fourths cupful of flour, one teaspoonful of soda. Stir in boiled chocolate, and bake in loaf.

FRENCH DATE CAKE.

Take two cupfuls of granulated sugar, six eggs, two cupfuls of flour, two teaspoonfuls of baking powder, one pound English walnuts chopped, one round dates chopped. Beat the white and yolk of eggs separately. Cream sugar and yolk of egg first. Add the white of egg. Gradually add flour without looking powder. Then the chopped nuts and dates.

SUNSHINE CAKE.

Sift one cupful of sugar and one of flour separately five times. Beat yolks of four eggs until light. Beat whites of eight eggs with pinch of salt until about half stiff, put in one-third teaspoonful of cream of tartar and beat until stiff. Add sugar and yolk of eggs and beat again hard. Fold in the flour lightly. Bake in moderate oven.

CAKE MAKING.

Never beat eggs for a cake. Drop the unbeaten whites in the last sugar and stir first enough to mix well with the batter. This is against all scientific rules for cake making, but after one trial you will not doubt, such soft, moist, light, fluffy cakes are the happy results.

GINGER CREAMS.
