"A SANITARIAN accident occurred at Shelburne, N. B., on the 1st inst., whereby the only daughter of Mr. Wm. Edmunds, the well-known representative of Thom. May & Co., Montreal, and a nurse in the service of Capt. Maxwell of the Guburn, lost their lives. It appears that both Capt. Maxwell's and Mr. Edmunds' families were spending the summer at the Walden House, and the girls were down at the bathing-house when they got into a small boat and were paddling with some pieces of wood. The boat drifted out some distance and the girls becoming frightened, went in about seven feet of water and were drowned in sight of several women on the shore, but no men were at hand. We deeply sympathize with the bereaved parents in their terrible affliction. Miss Edmunds was fourteen years of age and a universal favorite. Her father was in Georgetown at the time of the accident—her body was taken to Montreal for burial.
