This certainly looks well in a place like this, when only six years ago, it was a dreary wilderness, seldom visited by the white man. I may mention also that the first blast was taken (same day) in the new Foundry lately erected by Messrs. Burdock, Veerch & Co., and as they are determined to sell their castings as cheap as they can be had in old establishments, it will be a great advantage to the settlers.
