The London Times of the 13th ult. says:—Up to yesterday 13 cases of Asiatic cholera occurred, and 53 were fatal at New Castle. The disease had also broken out at Birmingham, where two cases were fatal. Two fatal cases also occurred at Morpeth. At Newcastle some cases had occurred with Asiatic cholera. Persons who were in apparent health were attacked and died in eight hours. One of the medical officers in taking the statistics of the disease, which appear to be trustworthy, in which they are now carefully watched by the members of the local board. At Morpeth there had been early preparations to meet the disease, the expectation that an order in council will be issued for the prevention of the disease.

New York, 4th. The Arabia from Liverpool September 14th, arrived at A. M. She brought 1300 passengers. And in so far as his conduct is concerned, he seems incapable of degrading that principle. What apology might be made for translating a man, like the Hon. James Ross, from the Upper House to the Cabinet, there is, we think, no plausible method of applying that apology to the case of Mr. Ross. The first is a man known as a politician and a reformer, the other is not known as either. We will say nothing of the motives that induced Mr. Ross to accept Mr. Galt as Crown Counsel—but we at once declare the act as an insult offered not only to Mr. Freeman, but to the whole reform party, and especially to the reformers of this section of the country. We are not so exceedingly democratic as to insist that all such appointments should be referred to a popular vote, but we do think that some respect should be had to the feelings of the party. And where such reformers as Mr. Freeman and Mr. Norton have been called aside to make room for a man of an opposite political creed, the reform party have just cause of complaint. Now, it is observed that we do not presume to question the professional abilities of either the Attorney-General Ross, or of Mr. Galt. We do not say one word about *Grand Jurors* or *Railroad Judges*, nor do we offer even a conjecture on the probability of the Hon. John Ross being interested in the *Globe* newspaper as a speculation. All we wish to say is substantially and simply this, that the new Attorney-General, Mr. Galt, is a man of an opposite political creed to the reform party, and that his appointment is an insult to the reform party, and especially to the reformers of this section of the Province to an extent that will be felt throughout the whole reform party and which would assuredly prevent Mr. Ross from being elected as a reformer, and that the fact that he does not require to seek a constituency, is, we think, a great pity, and not a good argument, in favor of responsible government.—*Canadian*.
