Washington, Dec. 19.-Lynchings in 1909 have numbered 70, the highest number recorded since 1904. The vic-time numbered eleven whites and fifty-nine negroes. The lynchings oc-curred in twelve states and one ter-ritory. New Mexico, as in previous years, crimes or alleged crimes against white women and murders caused most of these summary executions.


