Consecration and Enthronement the Bishop, of Grahamstown. (Church Times.)

On the Feast of St. Bartholomew the Very Rev. Francis R. Phelps, Dean of Grahamstown, was elected almost unanimously by the clergy to be Bishop of Grahamstown in the room of Dr. Cornish, who resigned in June last owing to failing health, after an episcopate of nearly sixteen years. The election was approved by the unanimous vote of the lay members af the Elective Assembly. It was a very happy circumstance that by the invitation of Dr. Cornish the annual meeting of the Provincial Standing Committee as well as a meeting of the Episcopal Synod was already fixed for November, the place of meeting being Grahamstown. This made it possible for the new Bishop to be consecrated in his own cathedral in the presence of his own flock, for in Grahamstown the Dean is also the

Rector of the Cathedral Parish. The consecration, on October 31 was a most striking service; and all the details had been very carefully thought out. There were nine bishops of the province present, as well as the Archbishop of Cape Town, and all were vested in cope and mitre. Many of the clergy of the diocese were present, and several from other dioceses of the province; among the priests who acted as chaplains to the bishops were to be seen, as was only fitting, some native priests. The sermon was preached by Canon West, Chancellor of Grahamstown Cathedral. He spoke of the importance of the office of the bishop as a guarantee of the unity of the Church, and on the bishop's relations to his comprovincial bishops, to his clergy and to his people. The South African Church Chronicle says that the preacher "dwelt in touching terms on the need felt by the clergy for frequent intercourse with their bishop, for sympathy, for encouragement, and for inspiration.'

The Bishop-elect was presented by the Bishops of Pretoria and Kimber lev and Kuruman. Before consecra tion he was vested in dalmatic and cope, and after the delivery of the Bible the Archbishop put into his hand the pastoral staff, on his breast the pectoral cross (the gift of the laity), and on his finger the episcopal ring (the gift of the clergy.)

The new bishop was enthroned ou the following day, the Feast of All Saints, by the senior priest of the diocese, the Archdeacon of Port Elizabeth, and then proceeded to the pulpit to address his first words as the


